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Politically Correct Christianity

The Holy Scripture clearly states that he who believes in Christ has eternal life, and those are the children of God and His elect.

There are innumerable verses practically in every book or every chapter of the New Testament that support this; and I feel that I need not to write them here since I am talking to real Christians who should know these verses.

But with great sorrow and regret there is a good number of Christians who believe that the Jews are still the elect people of God. That is because they hear certain preachers on the radio, on T.V., and in their churches, who for personal gains or ambitions preach **Politically correct Christianity**.

And when one discusses the subject with them, they all without exception say that God cannot cast out His people.

First, I, myself cannot say that God “**Cannot**” because God always “**Can**”. Inability is not one of His attributes.

Secondly, who are His people? God’s people are those believers who hear His voice and follow Him. Then this means that the Jews are no part of that.

Those who preach “**Politically correct Christianity**” have no biblical support for what they preach except that God “Cannot” which as I said above is the wrong thing to say about God.

But I have several proofs to what I say.

1) What did Jesus Himself say?

Mat. 8:11, 12. “And I say to you that many will come from east and west, and sit down with Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob in the Kingdom of heaven. But the sons of the Kingdom will be cast out into outer darkness. There will be weeping and gnashing of teeth.”

Here Jesus is talking to the Jews who were the sons of the Kingdom. He is telling them that they will not sit with Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob in the Kingdom of heaven, but other people from east and west will sit with them, and these are the Gentiles or believers regardless of their ethnic origin.

Mat. 21:43. “Therefore I say to you, the Kingdom of God will be taken and given to a nation bearing fruit of it.”

Here also Jesus is telling them that the Kingdom of God will be taken from them and given to others, and of course those others are the Gentiles.

Luke 13:28. “There will be weeping and gnashing of teeth when you see Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob and all the prophets in the Kingdom of God, and yourselves thrust out.”

And again here Jesus is telling them that they will be thrust out of the Kingdom of God.

2) What did Paul say?

Rom. 2:28,29. “For he is not a Jew who is one outwardly, nor is circumcision that which is outward in the flesh; but he is a Jew who is one inwardly; and circumcision is that of the heart, in the Spirit, not in the letter; whose praise is not from men but from God.

Here Paul is defining the true Jew who is circumcised in the heart by the Holy Spirit and not by the letter or the works of the law.

Rom. 8:14, 17. “For as many as are led by the Spirit of God, these are sons of God; and if children, then heirs- heirs of God and joint heirs with Christ.”

And here Paul is saying that the sons of God are those who are led by the Holy Spirit not those who are led by the works of the law, and that they will be joint heirs with Jesus Christ.

We also notice that in these two references, Paul is clearly defining the true Jew of the New Testament.

Rom. 9:1 – 3. “I tell the truth in Christ, I am not lying, my conscience also bearing me witness in the Holy Spirit, that I have great sorrow and continual grief in my heart, for I could wish that I myself were accursed from Christ, for my brethren, my countrymen according to the flesh.”

v. 6 “For they are not all Israel who are of Israel.”

v. 7 “Nor are they all children because they are the seed of Abraham”

Rom. 10:1. “Brethren, my heart desire and prayer to God for Israel is that they may be saved.

Here, why would Paul have deep sorrow and grief in his heart if his brethren and kinsmen have the same status of being the elect or sons of God? Apparently they are not.

Rom. 11:7. “What then? Israel has not obtained what it seeks, but the **Elect** have obtained it, and the rest were blinded.”

This is the bomb that shatters every Jewish dream; for Paul clearly mentions two categories of people: the elect and Israel, and the elect obtained what Israel could not obtain.

3) What did the Old Testament prophesy say?

Hosea 1:10. “In the place where it was said to them you are not my people, there it shall be said to them, you are sons of the living God.”

Hosea 2:23. “I will call them my people who were not my people.”

These two prophecies do not concern the lost Jews as they interpret them, but they concern the Gentiles who were never God’s people before but now they are.
